

## EAMENA-CPF Training 2020

## Week 0: Introduction and Preparation

To prepare for our first official week of training, we would like you to start thinking about the concept of a Watchlist and also to start thinking about a dataset that you'd like to work with for the rest of the training.

At its most basic, a Watchlist is a list of the most threatened and significant sites in a country. By the end of our training, we will ask you to contribute a list of 5-10 sites that you feel should be included on the list for your country. Try to think about sites which best represent the different types of archaeology, cultural periods, and regions in your country, as well as sites which have different types and severity of threats affecting them.

## Activities:

- 1. Open a web browser and navigate to the training website: <u>https://eamena.web.ox.ac.uk/cpf-training</u>
  - You may want to bookmark this site as this is where all of the training materials will be posted.
- 2. Watch the first video, under Week 0, on Watchlists.
  - Start thinking about any sites that you know of which might fall into this category.
- 3. Start thinking about a dataset of at least 30 sites that you think would be good to work with for the duration of the training
  - For example, a group of sites all within a certain geographic area, such as an EAMENA grid square or an area that you have surveyed, or a group of sites which have something in common, e.g. Neolithic tombs, Roman farms, etc.
  - These could be sites that already exist in the database (whether originally created by you or someone else), a new set, or a combination of both.
- 4. Discuss your choice of sites with your Training Manager.
  - There will also be time during the first week of training to finalise your choice when you have full access to the database, so do not worry if you have not completely decided before the training begins.
